On behalf of the Washington Aggregates & Concrete Association (WACA), I write to express our strong support for the Standardizing Permitting and Expediting Economic Development (SPEED) Act. As an organization representing the producers of essential aggregate, concrete & cement construction materials across Washington State, we commend your leadership in advancing legislation that modernizes the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and streamlines the permitting process for critical infrastructure.

Washington's growing population and economy demand robust investment in transportation, housing, energy, and environmental resilience. In Washington, where we are investing in clean energy, sustainable transportation, and climate-resilient infrastructure, the SPEED Act will help us deliver these benefits faster and more effectively.

We urge Congress to advance this legislation without delay. The SPEED Act is a critical step toward unlocking the infrastructure investments our state and nation so urgently need. Thank you for your continued leadership on this issue.
