Amendment to the Westerman ANS to H.R. 5103
Offered by Rep. Huffman

At the end, insert:

SEC. 4. VEHICULAR PURSUIT TRANSPARENCY AND PUBLIC REPORTING.

(a) **Reporting Requirement.** The United States Park Police shall establish and maintain a publicly accessible reporting system under which the Park Police shall, not later than 30 days after the conclusion of any vehicular pursuit that results in a collision, bodily injury, serious bodily injury, or death, publicly disclose a written report containing the information described in subsection (b).

(b) **Required Disclosures.** Each report required under subsection (a) shall include, at a minimum—

- (1) the legal and factual basis for the initial law-enforcement contact that precipitated the vehicular pursuit;
- (2) the date, time, duration, and general geographic location of the pursuit;
- (3) the total estimated amount of property damage resulting from the pursuit;
- (4) the number of fatalities, if any, disaggregated by whether each fatality involved a law-enforcement officer, the subject of the pursuit, or a third party;
- (5) the nature and severity of any injuries sustained by any individual, categorized as bodily injury, serious bodily injury, or death; and
- (6) with respect to law-enforcement officers, the number of officers injured or killed as a result of the pursuit, and the nature and severity of each such injury, categorized as bodily injury, serious bodily injury, or death;

(c) **Definitions.** In this section:

(1) The term “vehicular pursuit” means an active attempt by a United States Park Police law-enforcement officer operating a motor vehicle to apprehend one or more occupants of a moving motor vehicle, provided that the driver of such vehicle is aware of the attempt and is resisting apprehension by maintaining or increasing speed or by ignoring the law-enforcement officer’s signal to stop.

(2) The terms “bodily injury” and “serious bodily injury” have the meanings given to those terms in section 1365(h) of title 18, United States Code.

(d) **Form of Disclosure.** Information disclosed under this section shall be made available on a publicly accessible website of the National Park Service or the United States Park Police and shall be updated on an ongoing basis.

(e) **Rule of Construction.** Nothing in this section shall be construed to require the disclosure of information that would compromise an ongoing criminal investigation or endanger the safety of a law-enforcement officer or other individual, except that any withheld information shall be disclosed once such risk no longer exists.
