Mr. MCCLINTOCK introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To amend the Endangered Species Act of 1973 to provide that artificially propagated animals shall be treated the same under that Act as naturally propagated animals, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. TREATMENT OF ARTIFICIALLY PROPAGATED**
4 **ANIMALS.**

5 Section 4 of the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16
6 U.S.C. 1533) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
7 lowing new subsection:

1 “(j) TREATMENT OF ARTIFICIALLY PROPAGATED
2 ANIMALS.—The Secretary shall not distinguish between
3 naturally propagated animals and artificially propagated
4 animals in making any determination under this Act.”.

5 **SEC. 2. ARTIFICIAL PROPAGATION FOR MITIGATION PUR-**
6 **POSES.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 14 of the Endangered
8 Species Act of 1973 (relating to repeals of provisions of
9 law, which have executed) is amended to read as follows:

10 “ARTIFICIAL PROPAGATION FOR MITIGATION PURPOSES

11 “SEC. 14. The Secretary shall authorize the use of
12 artificial propagation of animals of a species for purposes
13 of any mitigation required under this Act with respect to
14 such species.”.

15 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—The table of con-
16 tents in the first section of such Act is amended by strik-
17 ing the item relating to such section and inserting the fol-
18 lowing:

 “Sec. 14. Artificial propagation for mitigation purposes.”.

19 **SEC. 3. APPLICATION.**

20 The amendments made by this Act shall apply with
21 respect to a species without regard to whether the species
22 was determined to be an endangered species or threatened
23 species under the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16

1 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.) before, on, or after the date of enact-
2 ment of this Act.
