The Asan Institute describes itself as follows: "The Asan Institute for Policy Studies is an independent, non-partisan think tank with the mandate to undertake policy-relevant research to foster domestic, regional, and international environments conducive to peace and stability on the Korean Peninsula, as well as Korean reunification. The Asan Institute was founded by Dr. Chung Mong Joon, honorary chairman and a seven-term member of the National Assembly of the Republic of Korea, on February 11, 2008."

In March 2015 I participated in the workshop "Managing Risks in the Shale Industry: Comparison of Policies Worldwide at the University of Pittsburgh," a workshop that was in part sponsored by the Center for Russian and East European Studies at the University of Pittsburgh. The University paid for my airfare (economy class) \$494.20, Super Shuttle transportation from the airport, and my hotel. I also received an honorarium of \$500 for helping to review papers presented at the workshop.
