- Served as a legal aid attorney (Army legal assistance program) at Fort Shafter, providing legal advice to soldiers and retirees on estate planning, family law, collection actions, and miscellaneous consumer issues
- Served as criminal defense attorney while stationed in Korea, defending soldiers in larceny, aggravated assault, kidnapping, rape and other cases; successfully litigated a kidnapping and indecent assault case from pre-trial hearing, through jury trial, to a full acquittal
