Bishop Lattime was consecrated the 8th Bishop Diocesan of Alaska September 4, 2010. His ministry and ecclesiastical oversight are among 48 Episcopal communities across the entire State of Alaska, including the Gwich'in villages of FT. Yukon, Chalkyitsik, Beaver; Venetie, Circle, Eagle, and Arctic Village. In addition to his Diocesan ministry, he serves on the Task Force on Creation Care and Environmental Racism of The Episcopal Church. Bishop Lattime was also a representative on both the 2015 and 2018 Episcopal Church General Convention Legislative Committee on Environmental Stewardship and Care of Creation.

He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Anthropology and Religion from Dickinson College, Carlisle, PA, and a Master of Divinity in Theology from Bexley Hall at Colgate Rochester Divinity School.

Before his election as Bishop of Alaska, Bp. Lattime was a parish priest in Geneseo, NY, in the Diocese of Rochester, where he also served as a District Dean, a Clergy Deputy to three Episcopal Church General Conventions (2003, 2006, and 2009), and was a Diocesan Stewardship Consultant.
