FPW's grants are the catalyst for leveraging agency and private philanthropic dollars and guiding those funds toward local restoration projects with <u>quantifiable outcomes</u>. To date FPW has issued over 1400 small grants that have leveraged over \$151 million dollars in private and public agency funds.

- Designated mediator by the Secretary of Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection between industry and environmental groups for improvement of state rules and regs for coal ash placement.
- Designated recipient for strategic investment of \$3.5 million dollars in water quality improvement practices, resulting from environmental litigation through Sierra Club and PennEnvironment against a coal fired power plant in the Little Conemaugh watershed.
