Questions from Rep. Stauber for [Mr. Tim Tarpley, President, Energy Workforce and Technology Council]

- 1. The BRIDGE Production Act requires the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) to utilize the 2017–2022 Record of Decision for the sales required in the bill, will BOEM still be required to conduct site-specific National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) reviews, including Environmental Assessments (EAs) or Environmental Impact Statements (EISs), to assess the unique environmental conditions and potential impacts of individual lease sales?
- 2. Can you elaborate on how the site-specific NEPA reviews will ensure that environmental safeguards are in place for each individual lease sale, even after the application of the 2017–2022 ROD?
