Though not litigation, in September 2022, LLOG received an Order to Perform Restructured Accounting and Pay from the Office of Natural Resources Revenue (ONRR). The Order was the result of an audit performed by ONRR of the royalty calculations from the period of 2016-2019. The Order cited certain areas where

ONRR did not agree with LLOG's royalty calculations and required LLOG to reperform its calculations. LLOG does not agree with the findings in the Order and has filed an appeal in November 2022 with the Interior Board of Land Appeals (IBLA).
