

Mr. Acteson has served as Chief Executive Officer of the Southeast Alaska Power Agency (SEAPA) since 2012. SEAPA is a regional Joint Action Agency of the State of Alaska that owns the Swan Lake and Tyee Lake hydroelectric facilities, 14 miles of submarine cables, and 175 miles of overhead transmission lines serving the municipalities of Ketchikan, Petersburg, and Wrangell. SEAPA delivers approximately 62% of the total power consumed by their member utilities and provides a broad range of ancillary services at a postage stamp rate.

Mr. Acteson's electric utility career has spanned over 33 years, encompassing a broad spectrum of power infrastructure across the state of Alaska. He started at Golden Valley Electric Association in 1984, specializing in power production systems, followed by 12 years with Chugach Electric Association where he managed a variety of utility assets including Alaska's largest power generation facility.

Mr. Acteson is a strong advocate for policy and regulatory improvements that will help ensure sustainable and affordable energy for ratepayers. He works closely with Federal and State leadership to cultivate change across the industry and is a frequent energy forum speaker. He's on the Board of Directors of the Alaska Power Association, serving as Co-Chair of the State-wide Manager's Forum and Vice-Chair of the Hydropower Working Group. He's Vice President of the Northwest Hydroelectric Association and is also an active member of the National Hydropower Association.
