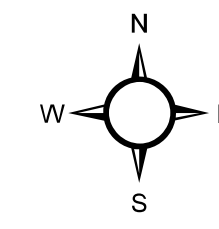
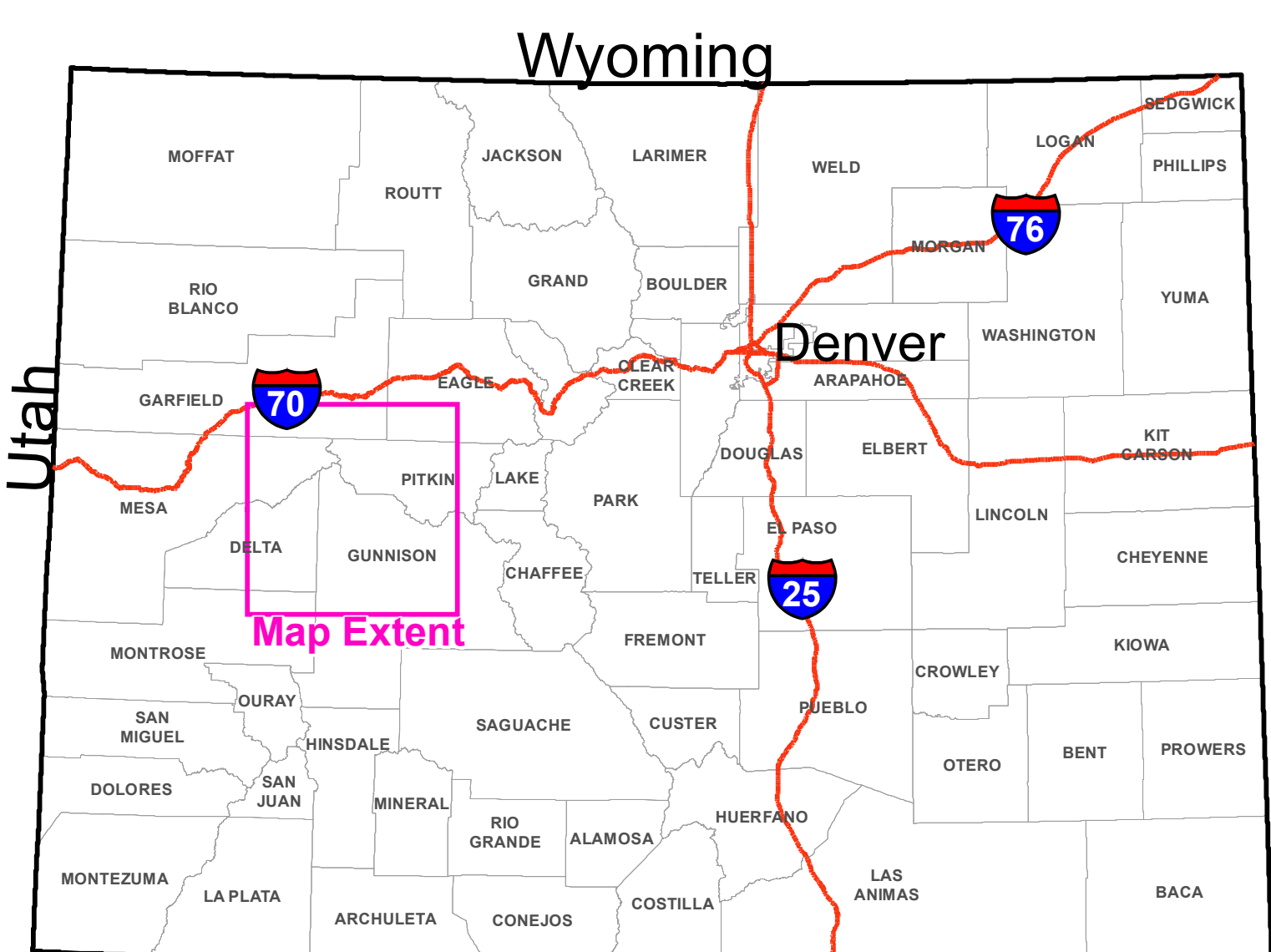
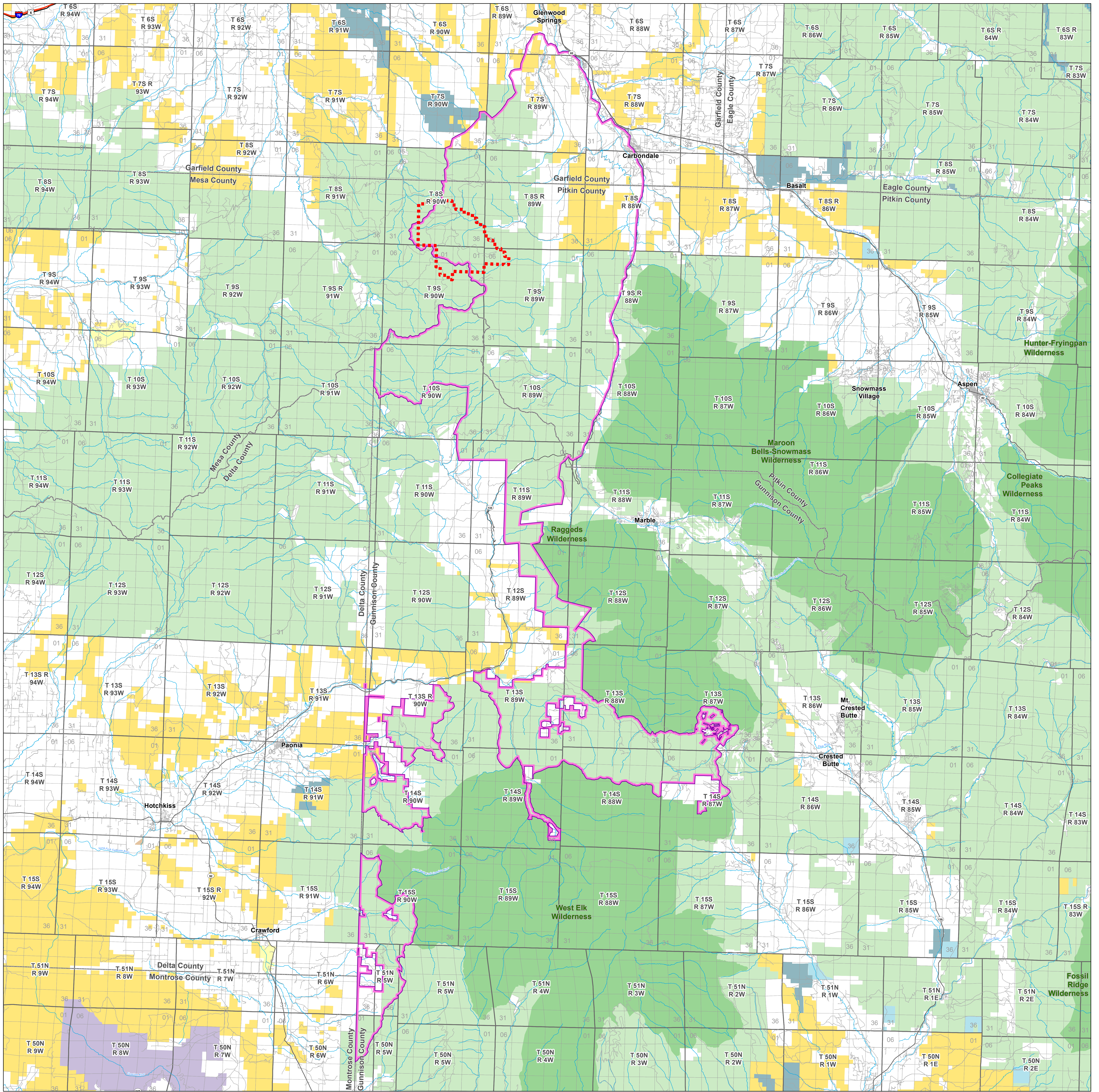


Greater Thompson Divide Area Map

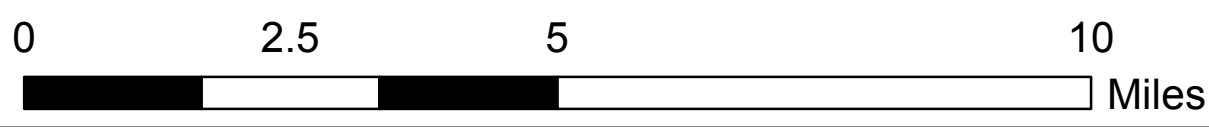

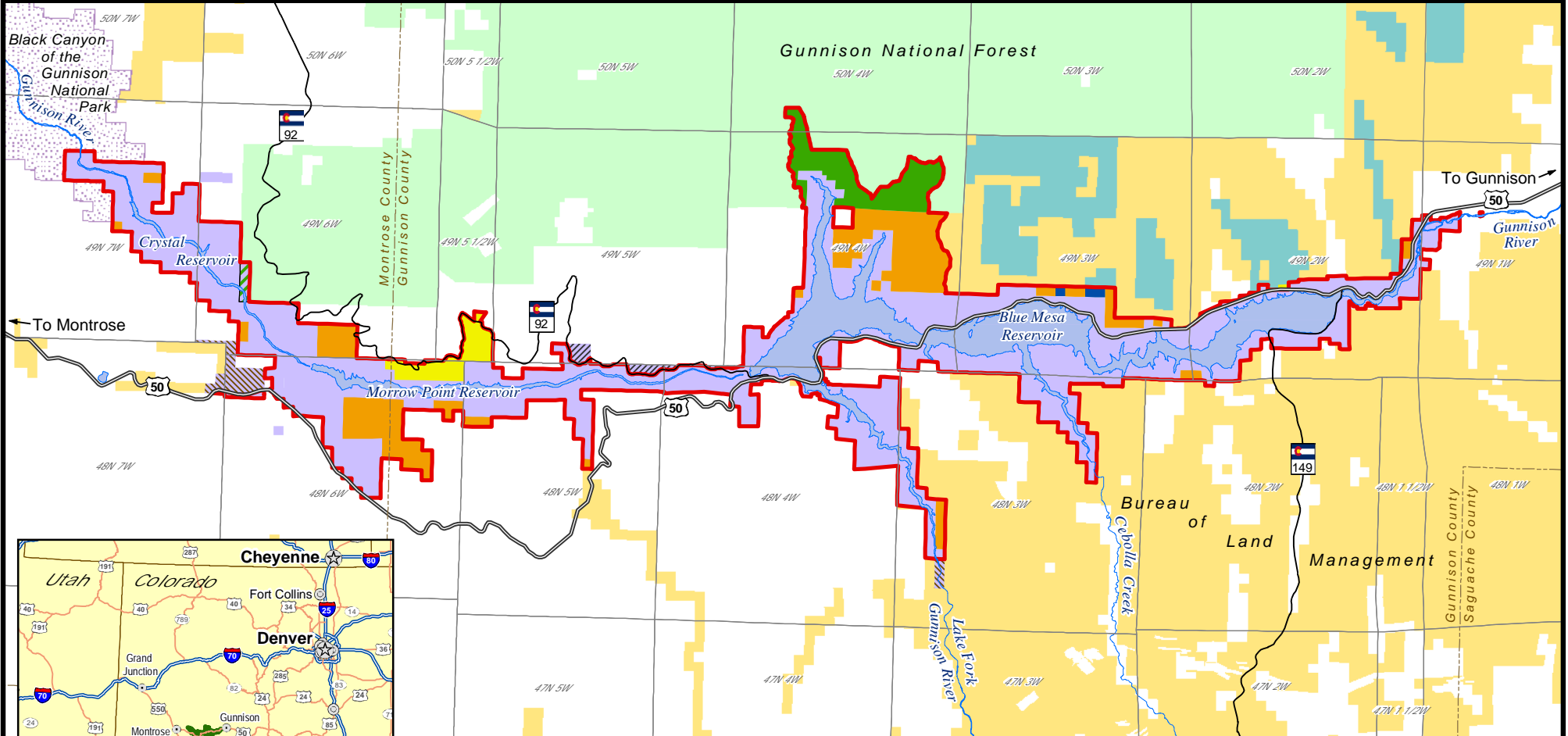

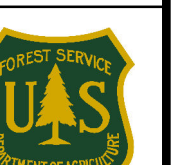
