

Joe Quinata is currently the Chief Program Officer of the Guam Preservation Trust and is a Founding and Board Member of the Asian and Pacific Islanders American in Historic Preservation (APIAHiP) and the Advisory Chair for the National Trust for Historic Preservation (NTHP). Mr. Quinata was recently appointed as a Trustee of the National Trust for Historic Preservation representing the National Trust Advisory Group. His career in historic preservation started 30 years ago when he opened the office of the Guam Preservation Trust, a non-profit, public corporation.

His community contributions include the Chairman and Founding Member of the Humatak Community Foundation, Board Member of the Inafa'Maolek Mediation Center, and Executive Council Member of the National History Day, Inc.
