## **Responsibilities**

- > Provide vision and direction for the co-op's policy engagements at the national, state and local levels, aiming to bend the U.S. narrative so that time outdoors is seen as a must-have, not a nice-to-have.
- > Build and sustain an extensive network of government, industry, academic, NGO and internal partners so that the co-op can engage effectively on any manner of philanthropic or policy topic.
- ➤ Collaborate with the co-op's communication channels to illustrate how the outdoors sustains the health of people, communities and the planet both increasing impact and raising brand value.
- Lead a high performing team that sets the strategy for and manages approx. \$8M per year in complementary philanthropy distributed nationwide among 400+ nonprofit partners.

## Key Achievements

- ➤ With an extensive cross-divisional team, co-led the creation and launch of REI's Cooperative Action initiative, the first piece of which is a grassroots advocacy platform, the Cooperative Action Network.
- ➤ Planted and cultivated the seed for what became the <u>REC Act</u>, a 2016 law requiring the U.S. Commerce Dept. to measure the size of the recreation economy. <u>The data</u> are now used ubiquitously.
- > By employing a pioneering narrative and networking across a range of states, have elevated top lawmakers' appreciation for the many social and economic benefits of outdoor recreation.
  - o Set the stage for the "Confluence Accords," a multistate compact on how public policy can maximize recreation's social and economic benefits. 13 states have now signed them.
  - o 17 states have created "offices of outdoor recreation" or advisory councils since 2013.
  - o The Nat'l Gov's Ass'n has launched a companion "learning network" with 23 states onboard.
  - Cultivated a nationwide network of 50+ internal and external champions to drive the effort.
- ➤ With modest investment of advocacy and philanthropy, have positioned REI as a national thought-leader on how time in nature improves both physical and mental health.
  - o Co-founded the <u>Nature & Health Initiative</u> at the University of Washington.
  - Laid groundwork <u>unanimous passage</u> of the <u>Accelerating Veterans Recovery Outdoors Act</u>, which obligates the USG to increase vets' healing opportunities via the outdoors.
- With internal and external partners, have built up REI's credibility as a positive change agent.
  - Brought in 100s of NGO and government partners to support the #OptOutside movement.
  - Maintained a #UnitedOutside posture even while <u>rallying 100s of businesses</u> to oppose the Administration's 2017 efforts to pare back protection of certain National Monuments.
  - Sustained that posture to help pass bipartisan public lands law in 2019 and in 2020.
  - Laid the first planks of REI's support for public policy aimed at combatting climate change.
  - o Helped guide the co-op's early, positive steps on questions of gender, sexuality and equality.
- > Currently, pivoting REI's philanthropy so employees and members can co-invest alongside the co-op to amplify impact. Aim is to increase collective investment multifold over the coming decade.

# Responsibilities

- > Guided the Secretary and the Department's senior leaders through policymaking decisions on data privacy, cybersecurity standards, intellectual property, radio spectrum, telecom and internet issues.

## Key Achievements

- ➤ Co-founded and co-led a first-ever <u>Internet Policy Task Force</u> (IPTF) across DOC. Instilled in the IPTF a collaborative cross-divisional ethos enabling DOC to serve as an Admin-wide thought-leader.
- > Shaped policy at the intersection of radio spectrum, public safety and national security. Yielded "First Net," a nationwide mobile communications network for first responders, shielded from hacking.

  - Enabling access to unused TV channels for last-mile connections, like MSFT's Airband.
  - o Laying groundwork for the Schools, Health, Libraries Broadband <u>Coalition</u> which promotes federal programs that bring fiber to these community hubs.
- > Served as policy lead on E-SIGN, a U.S. law that allows e-signatures to replace ink on all contracts.
- Represented MSFT in v.1 of policy deliberations on e-privacy, digital content, accessibility, security.
- > Assembled cross-div. input and wrote MSFT's first Corporate Social Responsibility report in 2003.
