



William Gibbons-Fly

William (Bill) Gibbons-Fly is the Executive Director of the American Tunaboat Association (ATA), representing the owners and operators of the U.S. Pacific tuna purse seine fleet. Previously, Mr. Gibbons-Fly spent 30 years with the U.S. Department of State where, from 2004 to 2017, he served as the Director of the State Department's Office of Marine Conservation. In this capacity, among other responsibilities, he served as the lead negotiator for the United States on a wide range of international treaties, agreements, and arrangements on oceans and fisheries related matters.

Mr. Gibbons-Fly is a former Chairman of the UN Food and Agriculture Organization's Committee on Fisheries, the largest and most prominent body guiding policy and technical developments for the fisheries and aquaculture sector worldwide. He is a past Chairman of the Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission, the Western Central Atlantic Fisheries Commission, and numerous other international fisheries management bodies. He is a former member of the Western Pacific Regional Fishery Management Council in Honolulu, and a former Distinguished Visiting Scholar at the Law of the Sea Institute at the University of California Berkeley School of Law.

Mr. Gibbons-Fly holds an M.A. in International Affairs from the George Washington University and a B.A. (with honors) from the University of California at Santa Barbara.
