 - Safari Club International, SCI Bow Hunters West Michigan Chapter, and Sportsmen's Alliance Foundation jointly sued the Department of Education concerning the Department's interpretation of the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act and its impact on the use of federal funding for archery and hunter education programs in schools. However, the recently enacted Protecting Hunting Heritage and Education Act has rectified the misinterpretation of the BSCA, effectively mooting the litigation. Nevertheless, the case has not yet been dismissed and is technically still active.
