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## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to establish 2 grant programs to sustain populations of species of migratory waterfowl through the deployment of tools and practices that complement habitat conservation.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Habitat Enhancement  
5       Now Act”.

6       **SEC. 2. GRANT PROGRAMS TO SUSTAIN POPULATIONS OF**

7                   **SPECIES OF MIGRATORY WATERFOWL.**

8       (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

1                         (1) the maintenance of healthy populations of  
2 migratory birds in North America is largely depend-  
3 ent on the protection, restoration, and management  
4 of wetland ecosystems and other habitats in Canada,  
5 as well as in the United States and Mexico, as iden-  
6 tified in the Implementation Plans of Joint Ventures  
7 authorized under the North American Waterfowl  
8 Management Plan;

9                         (2) duck populations in North America are  
10 being threatened by the loss in the quantity and  
11 quality of breeding habitat, which leads to declining  
12 nest success;

13                         (3) low nest success has been widely docu-  
14 mented to be the key annual driver in duck popu-  
15 lations;

16                         (4) additional tools can be employed to increase  
17 nest success to complement the private, State, and  
18 Federal habitat conservation programs and efforts in  
19 order to sustain healthy waterfowl populations;

20                         (5) relatively modest investments in manage-  
21 ment can make meaningful impacts towards  
22 supplementing waterfowl production in areas where  
23 waterfowl production outcomes have not been fully  
24 met;

1                         (6) numerous studies have made it clear that  
2                         nesting structures, in particular “hen houses”, are  
3                         the most efficient and cost-effective tool for increas-  
4                         ing nest success; and

5                         (7) providing incentives to private landowners  
6                         to establish nesting cover, create or restore brood  
7                         ponds, and provide brood water is a priority to en-  
8                         hance production of mallards, gadwalls, and other  
9                         breeding ducks in California.

10                         (b) GRANT PROGRAMS.—

11                         (1) HEN HOUSE GRANT PROGRAM.—

12                         (A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall es-  
13                         tablish a competitive grant program to award  
14                         amounts to eligible entities to strategically  
15                         place, build, and maintain hen houses in the  
16                         prairie pothole region for the purpose of im-  
17                         proving the nesting success rates of populations  
18                         of species of migratory waterfowl.

19                         (B) APPLICATIONS.—To be eligible for a  
20                         grant under this paragraph, an eligible entity  
21                         shall submit to the Secretary an application in  
22                         such form, at such time, and containing such  
23                         information as the Secretary determines appro-  
24                         priate.

25                         (2) BREEDING HABITAT GRANT PROGRAM.—

1                                     (A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall es-  
2   tablish a competitive grant program to award  
3   amounts to eligible entities to develop breeding  
4   habitat for species of migratory waterfowl within  
5   California for the purpose of enhancing the  
6   breeding success rates of populations of species  
7   of migratory waterfowl, including by—

8   (i) establishing nesting cover;  
9   (ii) creating brood ponds; and  
10   (iii) providing incentives to willing  
11   landowners to carry out the activities de-  
12   scribed in this subparagraph on land under  
13   the control of such landowners within Cali-  
14   fornia.

15                                     (B) APPLICATIONS.—To be eligible for a  
16   grant under this paragraph, an eligible entity  
17   shall submit to the Secretary an application in  
18   such form, at such time, and containing such  
19   information as the Secretary determines appro-  
20   priate.

21                                     (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

22   (1) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—The term “eligible enti-  
23   ty” means—

24   (A) a State, local, or Tribal government;  
25   (B) a nonprofit organization; and

1                         (C) an individual.

2                         (2) HEN HOUSE.—The term “hen house”  
3 means a type of cylindrical nest structure installed  
4 on a post in a prairie pothole.

5                         (3) PRAIRIE POTHOLE.—The term “prairie pot-  
6 hole” means a depressional wetland, including a  
7 freshwater marsh, that provides vital habitat to spe-  
8 cies of nesting waterfowl and other species.

9                         (4) PRAIRIE POTHOLE REGION.—The term  
10 “prairie pothole region” means North Dakota, South  
11 Dakota, Montana, Iowa, and Minnesota.

12                         (5) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means  
13 the Secretary of the Interior.

14                         (d) FUNDING.—For each of fiscal years 2024  
15 through 2028, of the amounts appropriated or otherwise  
16 made available to the “Department of the Interior—Office  
17 of the Secretary—Departmental Operations” account for  
18 each such fiscal year—

19                         (1) \$1,500,000 shall be made available to carry  
20 out subsection (b)(1); and

21                         (2) \$1,500,000 shall be made available to carry  
22 out subsection (b)(2).
