Milton Eugene "Geno" Evans Jr. is a fifth-generation Floridian and lifelong advocate for agriculture, aquaculture, and land stewardship. Born in Orange City and raised in Pierson, Geno grew up immersed in Florida's farming traditions. His early involvement in 4-H and FFA shaped a career centered on innovation, sustainability, and rural prosperity.

Geno's agricultural roots trace back to his great-great-grandfather, "Papa Hatcher," an orange grower in DeLand. That legacy lives on at Evans Farms, founded by his parents in 1982. Spanning 2,600 acres, the farm is nationally recognized as a pioneer in land-based aquaculture — one of the first U.S. producers of Hybrid Striped Bass and among the few caviar operations cultivating multiple sturgeon species in closed-loop systems. Evans Farms also produces Florida Largemouth Bass, Bluegill, Tilapia, hay, forage crops, and maintains a 200-head cattle operation.

A true family enterprise, Evans Farms includes Geno's mother, Marilyn; his siblings, Todd Evans and Jane Davis; his son, Trae, who leads field and conservation operations; his daughter, Kandi, who manages cattle operations; his granddaughter, Kalie; and his niece, Lauren Mazzola, a graduate of Auburn University's aquaculture program.
