Biography of Fort Belknap Indian Community Chief of Police Joshua Roberge

Fort Belknap Indian Community (FBIC) Chief of Police Joshua Roberge dedicated his career to serving his tribal community. Chief Roberge previously served in the United States Army. During that time, he proudly wore the United States flag on his shoulder while fighting foreign enemies. After being honorably discharged, he now serves as the Chief of Police for the Fort Belknap Indian Community. Chief Roberge has been in law enforcement for the FBIC for 12 years and has been the Chief of Police for 4 years.

Chief Roberge joined the FBIC Police Force to serve his people by helping protect FBIC tribal homelands and to keep FBIC communities safe. Today much of his time is spent combatting transnational drug cartels on FBIC's home soil.

FBIC consists of the Assiniboine (Nakoda) and Gros Ventre (Aaniih) Nations. Chief Roberge is a member of the Assiniboine Nation.
