Jeff Reinbold is the President and CEO of the National Park Foundation. He brings over three decades of leadership experience with the National Park Service (NPS). In his current role, Reinbold works with the Board of Directors of the Foundation to deploy grants nationwide, mobilize a powerful network of over 470 park partners, and work with congressional leaders to champion the reauthorization of the Great American Outdoors Act's Legacy Restoration Fund.

Prior to becoming the National Park Foundation's CEO, Reinbold most recently served as the Superintendent of the National Mall and Memorial Parks in Washington, D.C. In this role, Reinbold was responsible for overseeing large-scale restoration initiatives for the nation's most iconic memorials and improving the experience for over 30 million annual visitors to "America's Front Yard." Previously, Reinbold served as the Assistant Director of Partnerships and Civic Engagement for the NPS. His career includes leading planning and partnership projects nationwide, such as the creation of Flight 93 National Memorial in Shanksville, Pennsylvania. Working closely with community members, local volunteers, and families of the Flight 93 passengers and crew, Reinbold helped preserve the crash site and create a distinctive memorial honoring those who lost their lives stopping the fourth plane on September 11th from reaching Washington, D.C.

Reinbold holds a master's degree in city and regional planning from The Ohio State University and a bachelor's degree in geography from the University of Pittsburgh.
