Teach For America is pleased to endorse the Tribal School Federal Insurance Parity Act, H.R. 895, introduced by Congressman Dusty Johnson (R-SD) and we hope the subcommittee will advance this important legislation.

The legislation would allow tribal grant schools to participate in the Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) and Federal Employees Group Life Insurance (FEGLI) programs. This change would free up resources to improve recruiting and retention efforts for professional educators in tribal communities by allowing schools to spend less on health insurance and more on education-specific items.

By endorsing this bill, Teach For America is standing by our long-term belief that Native students should have an equal opportunity to attain an excellent education. Providing Native children with a quality education is central to the federal government's trust responsibility to tribes.
