Anna Maria Ortiz is a Director in GAO's Natural Resources and Environment team. She oversees GAO's portfolio focused on Native American and Tribal issues, identifying opportunities to improve the function and financial efficacy of federal programs that serve Tribes and their members. Dr. Ortiz coordinates efforts to enhance GAO's capacity for working on Tribal issues and collaborates throughout GAO on reviews of Indian, Alaska Native and Tribal programs related to health, education, energy, justice, child welfare, infrastructure and economic development. Dr. Ortiz joined GAO in 2005 as a statistician for GAO's Applied Research and Methods team, where she specialized in multivariate statistical modeling and complex data analysis and provided guidance on research design and fraud detection methodologies for GAO's Forensic Audits and Investigative Services team. Prior to her current position, Dr. Ortiz also worked as an Acting Director in GAO's Financial Markets and Community Investment Team, focusing on issues related to identity theft, credit reporting agencies, insurance technology, and diversity. Dr. Ortiz is an adjunct faculty member with GAO's Learning Center, and has taught courses in statistical modeling, sampling and diversity and inclusion. Before joining GAO, she was a civil rights analyst at the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights and a study director at the Institute for Social Research at the University of Michigan.

Dr. Ortiz earned her Ph.D. and M.A. degrees in political science from the University of Michigan, and a bachelor's degree in political economy from Princeton University.
