Andy Teuber is President for the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium, its highest-ranking officer. In his role, he oversees executive functions and integration of board policy throughout the Consortium for the benefit of the Alaska Native people we serve. Mr. Teuber also fills the role of Chairman for the **ANTHC Board of Directors**.

An enrolled member of Tangirnaq Native Village (a federally recognized Tribe), Mr. Teuber has served as ANTHC's chairman of the board since 2008 and as **president and CEO of the Kodiak Area Native Association** (KANA) since 2006. He holds a Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Washington and operates Kodiak Helicopters, LLC in Kodiak. He is active in the community and serves on a many boards, including the University of Alaska Board of Regents; Alaska Federation of Natives; Special Olympics of Alaska, Alaska Airlines Community Advisory Board; Tangirnaq Council;, the Alutiiq Heritage Foundation and the Federal Communications Commission's Native Nations Communications Task Force.

Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium is a non-profit Tribal health organization designed to meet the unique health needs of Alaska Native and American Indian people living in Alaska. In partnership with the more than 175,000 Alaska Native and American Indian people that we serve and the Tribal health organizations of the Alaska Tribal Health System, ANTHC provides world-class health services, which include comprehensive medical services at the Alaska Native Medical Center, wellness programs, disease research and prevention, rural provider training and rural water and sanitation systems construction.

ANTHC is the **largest**, **most comprehensive Tribal health organization** in the United States, and Alaska's secondlargest health employer with **more than 3,000 employees** offering an array of health services to people around the nation's largest state.

The Kodiak Area Native Association is a non-profit corporation providing health and social services for the Alaska Natives of Kodiak Island. KANA provides services to the City of Kodiak and six rural villages only accessible by boat or plane. Services provided include an ambulatory medical care, dental care, pharmacy, contract health (purchased health services), Community Health Aide Program, substance abuse prevention, non-clinical community health and youth prevention projects.



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
