She served as a legislative assistant for Senator Lisa Murkowski in Washington D.C. responsible for policies addressing infrastructure & sanitation, housing, health delivery, public safety and justice, land management, as well as fish & wildlife management for Alaska Natives and rural Alaskans. She was as the lead staffer in establishing the Senate Arctic Caucus. She assisted in organizing the Arctic Imperative Summits in Girdwood, Alaska to bring arctic and coastal Alaskan issues to the forefront of American policy.

Megan was born and raised in Nome, Alaska and takes pride in Inuit dancing and learning her Inupiaq language. She holds a Master's in Applied Economics from Johns Hopkins University and a B.S. in Economics from George Mason University.
