3		distinctive culture and traditions" (Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation,		
4		Preamble); and		
5	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation also vests the Legislative Council		
6		with the authority to "preserve and cultivate native arts, crafts and traditions"		
7		and to "consult with the Congress of the United States and appropriate federal		
8		agencies regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation"		
9		(Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(8) and Section 1(j)); and		
10	WHEREAS,	United States Senator Martin Heinrich, Senator Lisa Murkowski, Representative		
11		Teresa Leger Fernández, Representative Don Young, Representative Tom Cole,		
12		and Representative Sharice Davids recently introduced the Senate and House of		
13		Representatives versions of the Safeguard Tribal Object of Patrimony ("STOP")		
14		Act to prevent the export of tribal cultural heritage items and to secure their		
15		international repatriation; and		
16	WHEREAS,	the illegal trafficking of tribal cultural heritage items has negatively impacted		
17		tribes across the country; and		
18	WHEREAS,	the STOP Act would aim to stop the export of tribal cultural heritage items		
19		protected under federal law, facilitate international repatriation, and facilitate		
20		"coordination among federal agencies and tribes in protecting and repatriating"		
21		cultural heritage items and aiding the voluntary return of these items (STOP Ac		
22		Briefing Paper); and		
23	WHEREAS,	the Cultural Preservation and Appropriations Committees have reviewed the		
24		STOP Act and recommend supporting the federal legislation.		
25	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council supports th			
26		STOP Act and urges its passage.
