Questions from Rep. Leger Fernández for Hon. Johnathan Nez, President, Navajo Nation & Navajo Area Representative, National Indian Health Board

- 1. Considering the immense impact that COVID-19 continues to have on tribal communities, can you provide an example of what would occur if another government shutdown might have on tribal health disparities?
- 2. It can be tough to adequately recruit and retain staff, especially for specialty positions, in rural communities like the ones I represent.
 - a. President Nez, would you please help us better understand the impact that CRs and shutdowns can have on staffing, which is critical to delivering the best care?
- 3. President Nez, you noted how a lack of funding during shutdowns often requires tribes to use their funds or even take out private loans.
 - a. Whether it's redirecting staff from other necessary projects or potentially harming tribes' credit rating, what is the ripple effect of CRs on tribal governments and services more broadly?
