

AMENDMENT TO H.R. 1656

OFFERED BY MR. Goodlatte

Page 2, beginning on line 14, strike “knowingly, and with the intent” and all that follows through “official functions” on line 20 and insert the following: “knowingly, and with the intent to enter a restricted building or grounds, causes any object to enter any restricted building or grounds, when, or so that, such object, in fact, impedes or disrupts the orderly conduct of government business or official functions”.

Beginning on page 2, strike line 21, and all that follows, through line 19 on page 3, and insert the following:

1 SEC. 4. THREATS AGAINST FORMER VICE PRESIDENTS.

2 Section 879 of title 18, United States Code, is
3 amended—

4 (1) in subsection (a)—

5 (A) by redesignating paragraphs (2), (3),
6 and (4) as paragraphs (3), (4), and (5), respec-
7 tively; and

8 (B) by inserting after paragraph (1) the
9 following:

1 “(2) a former Vice President or a member of
2 the immediate family of a former Vice President;”;
3 and

4 (2) in subsection (b)(1)—

5 (A) in subparagraph (A)—

6 (i) by striking “subsection (a)(1)” and
7 inserting “paragraphs (1) and (2) of sub-
8 section (a)”; and

9 (ii) by inserting “or former Vice
10 President” after “former President” each
11 place it appears; and

12 (B) in subparagraph (B), by striking “sub-
13 section (a)(2) and (a)(3)” and inserting “para-
14 graphs (3) and (4) of subsection (a)”.

Page 4, line 20, strike “80” and insert “85”.

Page 4, beginning on line 11, strike “Presidential
Protective Detail”.

Add, at the end of the bill, the following:

15 **SEC. 12. SECURITY COSTS FOR SECONDARY RESIDENCES.**

16 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Presidential Protection As-
17 sistance Act of 1976 (18 U.S.C. 3056 note) is amended
18 by striking section 4 and inserting the following:

1 **“SEC. 4. NOTIFICATION REGARDING EXPENDITURES ON**
2 **NON-GOVERNMENTAL PROPERTIES.**

3 “The Secret Service shall notify the Committees on
4 Appropriations of the House and Senate of any expendi-
5 tures for permanent facilities, equipment, and services to
6 secure any non-Governmental property in addition to the
7 one non-Governmental property designated by each
8 protectee under subsection (a) or (b) of section 3.”.

9 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—The Presidential
10 Protection Assistance Act of 1976 (18 U.S.C. 3056 note),
11 as amended by this Act, is further amended—

12 (1) in section 3(b), by striking “any expendi-
13 tures by the Secret Service” and all that follows
14 through “imposed under section 4” and inserting
15 “any expenditures by the Secret Service for perma-
16 nent facilities, equipment, and services to secure the
17 non-Governmental property previously designated
18 under subsection (a) are subject to the requirements
19 set forth in section 4”; and

20 (2) in section 5(c), by striking “within the limi-
21 tations imposed under section 4”.

22 **SEC. 13. ESTABLISHMENT OF ETHICS PROGRAM OFFICE.**

23 Subject to the oversight of the Office of Chief Counsel
24 of the United States Secret Service, the Director of the
25 Secret Service shall establish an Ethics Program Office,
26 consisting of a minimum of 2 employees, to administer the

1 provisions of the Ethics in Government Act of 1978, as
2 amended, and to provide increased training to employees
3 of the United States Secret Service.
