Joseph Edlow serves as a Deputy Assistant Attorney General with the Office of Legal Policy at the Department of Justice where he primarily focuses on immigration policy matters. Prior to joining the Department, Mr. Edlow worked in the House of Representatives from 2015-2018, first in the Office of Rep. Raul Labrador (R-ID) and then as counsel on the Immigration and Border Security Subcommittee of the House Judiciary Committee. In the latter role, Mr. Edlow focused on enforcement and criminal immigration matters. Prior to that, he worked for six and a half years for the Office of the Principal Legal Advisor (OPLA), Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), Department of Homeland Security (DHS) as an Assistant Chief Counsel in the Baltimore Field Office. Mr. Edlow regularly represented DHS in removal proceedings before the U.S. Immigration Courts and advised ICE's law enforcement components on immigration and criminal matters. Mr. Edlow specifically handled all gang matters, was involved in worksite enforcement, and national security matters.

Mr. Edlow earned a Bachelor of Arts from Brandeis University and a Juris Doctor from Case Western Reserve University School of Law.
