Dear Mr. Chairman:

On behalf of the free market and conservative groups below, we are writing in support of the passage of the Protecting Third Party Litigation Funding From Abuse Act, a landmark bill which requires that outside entities disclose any financial investments made in a federal court case. By passing this legislation, Congress has an opportunity to close legal loopholes that allow hidden actors to influence lawsuits and subvert trust in our justice system.

All parties deserve to know who's financing a case and influencing outcomes. Judges need to see who's driving cases in their courtrooms, and plaintiffs need to understand if secret funding is involved so they can stay in control of their own cases. And defendants need to know who might have access to their intellectual property, who could be calling the shots in the litigation for the other side, and who is really pulling the strings during negotiations.

Legal proceedings should be decided on merit, not by shadowy third parties driven by profit motives. Without litigation transparency, anonymous financiers will continue exploiting the system from behind the scenes, placing their financial gains above the interests of justice.

We urge you to pass the Protecting Third Party Litigation Funding From Abuse Transparency Abuse Act, a common-sense reform that champions accountability and fairness while protecting our judicial system. By bringing those who are profiting from our legal system to light, we can ensure U.S. courts serve justice, not hidden interests.
