Donald Neufeld

Donald Neufeld has served as the Associate Director for Service Center Operations (SCOPS) for U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services since January 2010. In this position, he oversees all planning, management and operational functions of USCIS' Service Centers, leading a workforce of about 5,000 government employees and 1,800 contract employees. With locations in California, Nebraska, Texas, Vermont and Virginia, the five service centers collectively adjudicate more than five million immigration-related requests annually.

Mr. Neufeld's career with USCIS and the legacy Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) spans more than 35 years.
