My name is Don Rosenberg. I am a retired entertainment and publishing executive.

My second life began on November 16, 2010 when my son Drew, a law student in San Francisco, was killed by Roberto Galo an illegal alien from Honduras.

After being told that Galo was in the country illegally, I was told that he was here legally but was driving without a license.

I began my public advocacy working to get driving without a license laws to be enforced. I quickly learned that over twenty percent of all fatalities were caused by unlicensed drivers.

I testified in Sacramento and Los Angeles, appeared on radio and television programs, and appeared in front of groups to explain how dangerous unlicensed drivers were.

Eleven months after Drew's death I discovered that Roberto Galo was in the country illegally. Despite that information, I continued to focus on all unlicensed drivers regardless of immigration status.

Unfortunately, illegal alien advocates defended unlicensed drivers for those here illegally and tried to justify their position by incorrect claims about the danger and claiming that illegal aliens were so important to our economy that whatever tragedies they caused were excusable.

What they were saying was not true and I now had to defend my position by debunking statements that had nothing to do with driving.

That forced my involvement with the illegal immigration issue.

For years I worked on my own but in late 2016, working with other victims of illegal alien crimes created Advocates for Victims of Illegal Alien Crime.

We officially launched in June 2017 and this has been my life since then.
