

**The Honorable Frank J. Bailey**  
**United States Bankruptcy Judge for the District of Massachusetts**

Frank J. Bailey was appointed by on January 30, 2009 and he served as Chief Judge from December 2010 until December 2015. His chambers are in Boston. He was born in Kingston, New York, received his undergraduate degree from Georgetown University, School of Foreign Service (BSFS), and his law degree from Suffolk University School of Law (Boston). He also serves on the First Circuit Bankruptcy Appellate Panel. Judge Bailey has taught a variety of courses at Boston University School of Law, Suffolk University School of Law, and New England Law School.

Judge Bailey is the president of the National Conference of Bankruptcy Judges, a voluntary association of bankruptcy judges that has been in existence for over 100 years. He is the Judicial Member at Large on the Board of Governors of the American Bar Association and a member of the ABA House of Delegates. He recently served as the chair of the ABA Board Committee on the Profession, Public Service and Diversity.

Judge Bailey is also devoted to charitable work. He is Chair of the Immigrant Learning Center, Inc. in Malden, Massachusetts, a school that offers free, intensive English education to new Americans.

Judge Bailey is married to Susan L. Cahill, M.D., and has two sons, Matthew, who is a newly admitted lawyer and practices at Sullivan & Worcester LLP in Boston, and Michael, who works as an energy analyst at National Grid.
