

JOSH GOLDFOOT



Josh Goldfoot is an Acting Deputy Assistant Attorney General in the Department of Justice's Criminal Division, and a career member of the Senior Executive Service of the United States Government. He supervises the Criminal Division's Computer Crime and Intellectual Property Section (CCIPS), and the Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section (CEOS).

Prior to his current position, Mr. Goldfoot worked as Principal Deputy Chief of CCIPS for eight years, as Deputy Chief for Cyber Policy in the Department's National Security Division for three years, and as a trial attorney in CCIPS for seven years.

Mr. Goldfoot has authored or co-authored six law review articles about law and technology and received a United States patent in 2008 for shape recognition technology.

Mr. Goldfoot has received the Attorney General's John Marshall Award for his work on remote computer searches, the Attorney General's Distinguished Service Award for his work on a botnet takedown, the FBI Director's Award for an international hacking case, and four different Assistant Attorney General awards.
