The Subcommittee on Courts, Intellectual Property, and the Internet of the Committee on the Judiciary respectfully requests your testimony at a hearing titled, "Radio, Music, and Copyrights: 100 Years of Inequity for Recording Artists," on Wednesday, June 26, 2024, at 2 p.m., in room 2141 of the Rayburn House Office Building.

The hearing will examine why creators have traditionally not received royalty payments for the public performance of their creative works by nonsubscription terrestrial radio stations, as well as efforts to modernize copyright law. The hearing will explore competing legislative proposals, including the American Music Fairness Act of 2023, which would require a license for broadcasting creative works over the radio, and the Supporting the Local Radio Freedom Act, which aims to prevent Congress from imposing fees, licenses, or other charges related to the public performance of sound recordings. Please prepare a five-minute opening statement summarizing your testimony and be ready to answer questions from Committee Members.

(5)(A) Each committee shall, to the greatest extent practicable, require witnesses who appear before it to submit in advance written statements of proposed testimony and to limit their initial presentations to the committee to brief summaries thereof.

- (B) In the case of a witness appearing in a non-governmental capacity, a written statement of proposed testimony shall include—
 (i) a curriculum vitae; (ii) a disclosure of any Federal grants or contracts, or contracts, grants, or payments originating with a foreign government, received during the past 36 months by the witness or by an entity represented by the witness and related to the subject matter of the hearing; and (iii) a disclosure of whether the witness is a fiduciary (including, but not limited to, a director, officer, advisor, or resident agent) of any organization or entity that has an interest in the subject matter of the hearing.
