Experience

Attorney General — State of Minnesota

- Elected as Minnesota's 30th Attorney General on January 7, 2019. First African-American and the first Muslim American to be elected to statewide office in Minnesota.
- Lead prosecutor in the matter of the May 2020 death of George Floyd in Minneapolis and led the team that successfully convicted former Minneapolis police officer Derek Chauvin on a charge of second-degree unintentional murder, which resulted in the longest sentence of any police officer for killing a civilian while on duty in Minnesota.
- Led the team that successfully prosecuted former Brooklyn Center police officer Kimberly Potter on a charge of first-and-second degree manslaughter in the matter of the April 2021 death of Daunte Wright.
- During the COVID-19 pandemic, Attorney General Ellison enforced executive orders barring evictions and price-gouging, and successfully defended the constitutionality of pandemic-related executive orders in court.
- Reached historic national settlement with opioid manufacturers.
- Started the first statewide Conviction Review Unit in Minnesota after winning a \$300,000 grant from the Department of Justice.
- Created a Wage Theft Unit in the Attorney General's Office that has recovered over \$230,000 in unpaid wages in one year.

- Elected to the US House of Representatives in 2006. The first Muslim American ever elected to the United States Congress.
- Championed consumer, worker, environmental, and civil- and human-rights protections for Minnesotans.
- Served for 12 years on the House Financial Services Committee, where he helped oversee the financial services industry, the housing industry, and Wall Street, among others. Among his legislative accomplishments are passing provisions to protect credit-card holders from abusive practices and protect the rights of renters and tenants.
