I write to respectfully request the opportunity to testify as a witness in the February 6th hearing in the Subcommittee on the Administrative State, Regulatory Reform and Antirust regarding the California wildfires. As you know, I represent the Pacific Palisades and surrounding areas such as Malibu, which have been devastated by the costliest fire in American history.

The magnitude of these events highlights the urgent need for a robust recovery strategy that also addresses the needs of my constituents who now face significant financial challenges in rebuilding their homes.

While I recognize the urgency of this hearing and the potential constraints on witness participation, I urge the majority to convene a Member panel so Members representing districts impacted by these devasting fires can provide an update as well as articulate the federal response needed going forward to assist individuals to rebuild their lives. As a senior member of the House Financial Services Committee that has spent decades working to ensure adequate insurance coverage in California through public-private partnership, I believe my participation in this hearing would add valuable perspective to the Subcommittee's work. However, if time does not permit my

inclusion as a witness, I respectfully request an exception be made to committee rules to allow me to waive on to the subcommittee on February 6th, so that I may engage in questioning.

Thank you for your consideration of this request and I look forward to the opportunity to contribute to the discussion.
