Spearheaded the development of a comprehensive geriatric services line for entire health system

- Established and serves as the President of the Institute for Successful Living. The Institute is the first of its kind in NW PA. This is a center of excellence in geriatric medicine which coordinates all needs of geriatrics in NW PA.
- Established the first Acute Care for the Elderly unit in NW PA. This unit is housed at Millcreek Community Hospital.
- Established the Transitional Care Unit at the Millcreek Community Hospital. This unit is the first sub-acute rehabilitation unit in NW PA.
- Established the Inpatient Rehabilitation Unit at the Millcreek Community Hospital. This unit is the first acute inpatient geriatric rehabilitation unit in NW PA.
- Serves as the Project and Medical Director of the LECOM Senior Living Center. The LECOM Senior Living Center is an expansion of the Millcreek Manor, a 50 bed skilled nursing facility. The new facility has 138 bed and utilizes a new model of care including resident-centered care and culture change ideologies.
- Integrated the independent/assisted living communities, Regency at South Shore, Parkside North East, and Parkside Westminster. Led the team in incorporating different levels of services for geriatric care.
- Responsible for acquiring an additional 140 bed facility. Established and serves as the Medical Director of LECOM Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. LECOM Nursing and Rehabilitation Center is the only facility in NW PA that offers long term care beds that include ventilator services.
- Responsible for implementing a non-profit preventative health program for geriatrics and the health system. LECOM Center for Health and Wellness supplies over 10,000 vaccinations throughout NW PA. Preventative health programs include programming for continuous adult learners and chronic disease self management.
- Instrumental in acquiring the Visiting Nursing Association of Erie (VNA) and integrating the facility into LECOM Health. The VNA compliments the health system by allowing for the most integrative and comprehensive continuum of care, from acute care to end of life, for senior services in NW PA.
- Established and previous Co-Medical Director of the LECOM Wound Center of Hyperbaric Medicine.
- Established LECOM Home Care, LECOM Share Care, and LECOM Adult Day Program.
- Established LECOM Corry Independent Living.

2023 – Present	Rural Residency Planning and Development (RRPD) Program Director – Corry Memorial Hospital Internal Medicine Residency Established \$750,000 for the planning and development of a Rural Internal Medicine Residency out of a critical access hospital. With this grant, we were able to expand the training of internal medicine residents in the rural areas by developing a program based in Corry Pennsylvania at a critical access hospital. Corry Memorial Hospital is the first critical access hospital to establish an accredited internal medicine residency program. Corry Memorial Hospital is committed to providing the necessary financial support for administrative, education, and clinical resources, including personnel for the success of the Internal Medicine Residency Program. The Internal Medicine Residency Program aims to train physicians who are actively engaged in the teaching
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of medical student and residents throughout their career, retain graduating residents to practice in the community in which they trained and to encourage participation in a graduate medical education program as members of the faculty, contribute to the growing body of literature through research, and train physicians on the complexity of healthcare delivery in a rural community setting and value the services and expertise of all members of our healthcare team.

Program Director – Rural Residency Infrastructure Supports and Empowerment

Established \$750,000 to develop an Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) program to train medical residents in Rural PA. The goal of training in Rural PA is to retain these medical residents as doctors to help serve in rural areas.

Program Director - ECHO National Nursing Home COVID-19 Action Network

Established \$200,000 grant to implement Project ECHO to provide training, technical assistance, and mentorship to healthcare providers, so that they can provide high-quality, best-practice healthcare to patients. Leveraged this robust national ECHO network to rapidly deploy ECHO programs to train and support nursing home staff on best practices for protecting patients, staff, and visitors from deadly coronavirus infection and spread. Worked with the ECHO Institute at UNMHSC toward the following goals:

- Preventing COVID-19 from entering nursing homes via staff, visitors, and residents.
- Should the virus enter the nursing home, preventing greater spread among patients, staff, and visitors.
- Providing best-practice care and treatment for residents who test positive for COVID-19.
- Protecting staff from infection and ensuring best-practice safety measures, to help staff build
- confidence in their work, feel safe from infection, and support staff retention.
- Ensuring that residents who are dying from COVID-19 can safely receive visitors.

Program Director - Regional Response Health Collaborative (RRHC), Regional Congregate Care Assistance Teams (RCAT), Long Term Care- Resiliency Infrastructure Supports and Empowerment (LTC RISE), and LTC RISE 2.0

Established and maintains \$20.8 million LECOM NWPA Regional Response Health Collaborative to mitigate COVID-19 in NW PA. Through the RRHP grant, the program provided personal protective equipment, testing support, 24/7 call center, staffing assistance, staff training, contact tracing, and outbreak response to 7 counties in Northwestern PA. An extension of RRHC (RCAT) through 2021 provided outbreak response, a 24/7 call center, infection prevention and control, staff training, and use of monoclonal antibody treatment to residents of long-term care facilities. LTC RISE supports the current need of COVID mitigation by focusing on infection prevention, outbreak response, emergency preparedness, a 24/7 call center, staff wellness and overall resiliency. The RISE program also developed a Center for HEROs to deliver this support to long term care facilities in the expanded area of 13 counties in northwestern PA.
