Senator Gutierrez, his wife Sarah, and daughters Izabella and Victoria live in the Mission San Jose neighborhood. They are members of the Mission San Jose Parish and active in community projects.

As State Senator, Gutierrez is fighting for answers for Uvalde. Gutierrez is committed to protecting Texas children from gun violence. In the 87th Legislature, Gutierrez passed an amendment improving mental healthcare in rural Texas and a bill to address severe conditions affecting pregnancies.

As State Representative, Gutierrez served as Chairman of the Defense and Veterans' Affairs Committee where he established the National Warrior Resiliency Center for PTSD treatment, passed measures keeping Texas military bases open, and secured funding for the San Antonio State Hospital.

On San Antonio City Council, Gutierrez helped establish Texas A&M University at San Antonio and Mission Branch Library, the first library constructed on San Antonio's Southside in 30+ years.

Born and raised in San Antonio, Texas, Gutierrez graduated from Central Catholic High School (1989). He earned his B.A. in Political Science from the University of Texas at San Antonio (1995) and law degree from St. Mary's University School of Law (1998). He is Founder and President of the Gutierrez Law Firm, specializing in immigration law.
