After three years in D.C., she moved to Atlanta in 2008 to continue her work as a prayer missionary at the International House of Prayer Atlanta. During this time of prayer missions she traveled overseas to do short term missions trips in Holland, Italy, Guatemala, Nepal and spent three months serving the needy in Mozambique, Africa. After dedicating seven years to full time ministry she returned home to Connecticut and started writing professionally for the pro-life movement. Her writing has been featured in Live Action News, Life News, Charisma, LifeSite News and a number of other publications. Christina is a member of the National Black Pro-Life Coalition and travels throughout the country speaking at pro-life gatherings for Ambassador International. Her pro-life journey has been featured in two films, "Hear from Heaven" and "Pro-Life Feminist." One of her favorite jobs was serving as the Client Services Manager for four years at ABC Women's Center. There she managed a team of volunteers and aided pregnant women and their families through parenting classes and material support.
