

DANIEL DAE KIM has made a career of creating multifaceted and stereotype-breaking roles as an actor, director and now, producer. Currently, he can be seen in NBC's "New Amsterdam" playing trauma surgeon, Cassian Shin. This summer, he stars in the highly anticipated Netflix film "Stowaway," opposite Toni Collette and Anna Kendrick, as well as in the Sundance favorite "Blast Beat." Most recently, Kim was announced as one of the leads in National Geographic's scientific thriller anthology series, "The Hot Zone: Anthrax," and can also be heard in Disney's animated feature, "Raya and the Last Dragon."

Prior to his seven-season portrayal of Chin Ho Kelly on the juggernaut series "Hawaii Five-0," Kim was best known for his role as Jin Soo Kwon on the hit TV series "Lost," for which he shared a 2006 Screen Actors Guild Award for Best Ensemble and was individually honored with an AZN Asian Excellence Award, a Multicultural Prism Award and a Vanguard Award from the Korean American Coalition, all for Outstanding Performance by an Actor. He has been repeatedly recognized with the prestigious KoreAm Driven Award in the field of Arts and Entertainment, and has twice been named one of People Magazine's "Sexiest Men Alive."

Born in Busan, South Korea, and raised in New York and Pennsylvania, Kim discovered acting while a student at Haverford College. After graduation, he moved to New York City, where he began his career on stage, performing in classics such as "Romeo and Juliet," "Ivanov," and "A Doll's House." Despite early success, he deepened his knowledge of the craft by enrolling at New York University's Graduate Acting Program, where he earned his Master's Degree.

Upon completion of his MFA, Kim's film career began in earnest with roles in "The Jackal," "For Love of the Game," "The Hulk," "Spider-Man 2" and "The Cave," as well as the Academy Award-winning "Crash." He created the role of Jack Kang in "The Divergent Series" films, "Insurgent" and "Allegiant." In 2019, he starred as Ben Daimio in "Hellboy" and Ali Wong's narcissistic boyfriend, Brandon, in the all-Asian Netflix rom-com "Always Be My Maybe."

Kim has also lent his voice talents to animated series and films, such as the award-winning Studio Ghibli film, "The Tale of Princess Kaguya," as well as the PBS nature documentary series, "Big Pacific," and "Asian Americans." He can also be heard in AMC's upcoming animated series, "Pantheon." Kim has also voiced characters for several video games, most notably, Johnny Gat in the bestselling series, "Saints Row."

In 2015, Kim forged a new path in his career by creating his own production company, 3AD. With the goal of featuring those traditionally underrepresented in front of, and behind the camera, 3AD is currently developing a number of projects, as well producing ABC's current hit, "The Good Doctor," where he serves as Executive Producer.
