

Greg Stanton served as Phoenix mayor from 2012 to 2018, where he focused on building an economy rooted in innovation and trade.

In 2018, Stanton was elected to serve Arizona's 9th Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives and was reelected in 2020.

Starting his second term in Congress, Stanton is focused on many state-wide issues including increasing trade opportunities in Arizona, planning for the state's water future, and investing in public transportation and infrastructure.

Stanton is a member of the Transportation & Infrastructure Committee and the Judiciary Committee.

Before his election as mayor, Greg served nine years on the Phoenix City Council and as Arizona's Deputy Attorney General. He attended Marquette University on the Harry S. Truman Scholarship, and earned a law degree from the University of Michigan.
