Hammad Alam is Program Manager and Staff Attorney in the National Security and Civil Rights program at Asian Americans Advancing Justice-Asian Law Caucus. Mr. Alam's work at the Asian Law Caucus focuses on protecting communities, and in particular Arab, Middle Eastern, Muslim and South Asian communities, from government surveillance and policing in the name of national security and counterterrorism. As part of this work, Mr. Alam has provided direct representation to clients who have been questioned by local law enforcement, the FBI, and other federal agencies. Mr. Alam's work also includes advocating for an end to surveillance and policing programs that disproportionately and unjustly target communities on the basis of their religion, ethnicity, and national origin.
