Jay Schweikert is an attorney and research fellow with the Cato Institute's Project on Criminal Justice. His research and advocacy focuses on accountability for prosecutors and law enforcement, plea bargaining, Sixth Amendment trial rights, and the provision and structuring of indigent defense. He has written extensively on the subject of qualified immunity, including white papers, journal articles, and dozens of *amicus* briefs filed in courts around the country.
