Amanda Frost is the David Lurton Massee, Jr., Professor of Law at the University of Virginia. Professor Frost writes and teaches in the fields of constitutional law, immigration law, and citizenship law. Her scholarship has been cited by over a dozen federal and state courts, including the U.S. Supreme Court, and she has been invited to testify on the topics of her articles before both the House and Senate Judiciary Committees. Her non-academic writing has been published in *The Atlantic, the New York Times, the Washington Post, the New Republic, and USA Today*. In 2019, she was awarded a fellowship from the American Council of Learned Societies to complete her book, *You Are Not American: Citizenship Stripping from Dred Scott to the Dreamers* (2021), which was selected as a "New & Noteworthy" Book by the New York Times Book Review and was short-listed for the Mark Lynton History Prize.

Before entering academia, Professor Frost clerked on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit and spent five years as a staff attorney at Public Citizen, where she litigated cases at all levels of the federal judicial system. She is a graduate of Harvard Law School and Harvard College.
