

Matt O'Brien is FAIR's Deputy Executive Director. In this capacity, he is responsible for overseeing FAIR's investigation, legislation and education activities. Previously he served as the Director of Research at FAIR and as the Director of Investigations at FAIR's affiliate, the Immigration Reform Law Institute.

Matt is a nationally recognized expert on immigration law and policy having been published in a large number of major outlets including The Washington Times, The New York Post, The Boston Herald, Breitbart News and the Daily Caller. He has also been a frequent guest on talk radio, television and podcasts such as The Lars Larson Show, The Ingraham Hour and The Sara Carter Show.

In addition, Matt has three decades of frontline experience having held multiple senior positions within government and the private sector. Most recently, he was the Assistant Chief Immigration Judge overseeing the U.S. Immigration Court at Annandale, VA. In the past he served as the Chief of the National Security Division within U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services' Fraud Detection and National Security Directorate; as a Senior Advisor to the Citizenship and Immigration Services Ombudsman; as Assistant Chief Counsel with U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement; as a District Adjudications Officer with the former U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service; and as a private bar attorney with immigration law firms in Boston and New York.

Matt holds a Bachelor of Arts in French from the Johns Hopkins University, a Juris Doctor from the University of Maine School of Law, and both an Executive Master of Arts in National Security Affairs and a Doctor of Statecraft and National Security from the Institute of World Politics.
