Alison Craig is an assistant professor in the Department of Government at the University of Texas at Austin. Her research, which has been supported by the National Science Foundation, is focused on improving our understanding of the day-to-day functioning of the United States Congress, with an emphasis on the relationships between members and the challenges of policymaking in the modern legislature. She is currently working on a book, entitled The Collaborative Congress, which examines how rank-and-file members work together to create substantive and successful policy in a polarized House.

Dr. Craig earned her Ph.D. in 2017 from the Ohio State University and has a B.S. in political science from the University of Oregon. Prior to entering academia, she spent eleven years working for members of Congress as a legislative assistant on Capitol Hill and a field representative in her home state of Oregon.
