



Michael K Fox is a former Los Angeles Dodgers executive and an entrepreneur who has built Fox Transportation & Logistics, Inc. into a national logistics company which provides pharmaceutical product to 8,000 pharmacies and hospitals in 10-states every day. Michael was a Dodgers marketing executive and part of a front office team whose unique approach helped the Dodgers become the first MLB franchise to reach three million in fan attendance in a single season, a milestone few owners believed was possible at the time. Mike was the team's liaison to the International Olympic Committee and the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee to coordinate the planning, marketing and implementation of baseball as a demonstration sport in the 1984 Olympic Games. Mike then went on to open his own Sports Marketing Company and was hired full-time by American Golf Corporation to increase rounds of golf and practice range revenue on 100 courses across the country.

Michael K Fox is a former Los Angeles Dodgers executive, 52-year resident of the Los Angeles area and the entrepreneur who has built a successful Southern California-based business. He is a leading voice in the Los Angeles-area business community who frequently speaks before industry groups, elected officials and regulatory bodies. He is also the author of "Healing the Home Team" (Los Angeles Times, May 17, 2011), an insightful look at returning the Dodgers to their winning tradition, and "A new era for Major League Baseball", a series of proposals to engage fans and revitalize baseball. Mike was a Dodgers marketing executive from 1978 to 1988.

In 1983-84, Michael was the team's liaison to the International Olympic Committee and the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee to coordinate the planning, marketing and implementation of baseball as a demonstration sport in the 1984 Olympic Games. With the costs to stage the eight-day baseball competition at Dodger Stadium guaranteed by Mr. O'Malley, it was Michael's responsibility to ensure the event's financial and athletic success. To the surprise of many, the Olympic competition was wildly successful, drawing 385,000 fans to daily double-headers and making it the third-highest attended event (following only track and field and soccer) of the 32 events played in Los Angeles. As a result of the Los Angeles success, baseball was elevated to medal status for the 1992 games.

Mike left the Dodgers in 1988 to join Fox Transportation, the family business founded two years earlier by his father, who had become ill and could no longer lead the company on a daily basis.

Based in Rancho Cucamonga, Fox Transportation has grown into a national logistics company. Under Michael's leadership, the company has more than 800 employees and operates in 12 states, making two million deliveries to hospitals, long-term care facilities and retail locations annually. A pioneer in its use of clean truck technology, Fox Transportation has been recognized by the ports of Los Angeles and Long beach for its efforts to improve air quality in Southern California and was "2013 Business of the Year" by Rancho Cucamonga Chamber of Commerce. Michael earned a Bachelor of Science and Masters of Business Administration degrees from University of Redlands
