

## Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure U.S. House of Representatives Washington DC 20515

The Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure met at 10:00 a.m. in HVC-210, pursuant to notice, in an open session, a quorum being present, and considered the following measures:

- Fiscal Year 2020 Budget Views and Estimates of the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.
- **H. Con. Res. 16** Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the National Peace Officers Memorial Service and the National Honor Guard and Pipe Band Exhibition.
- H. Con. Res. 19 Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the Greater Washington Soap Box Derby.
- H.R. 1318 To direct the Library of Congress to obtain a stained glass panel depicting the seal of the District of Columbia and install the panel among the stained glass panels depicting the seals of States which overlook the Main Reading Room of the Library of Congress Thomas Jefferson Building.
- H.R. 639 To amend section 327 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act to clarify that National Urban Search and Rescue Response System task forces may include Federal employees.

The Committee took the following actions:

Fiscal Year 2020 Budget Views and Estimates of the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure. The Committee adopted the measure, without amendment, by voice vote.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. DeFazio to discharge the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management from further consideration of H. Con. Res. 16, H.Con. Res. 19, H.R. 1318, and H.R. 639, was not objected to.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. DeFazio to consider H. Con. Res. 16, H.Con. Res. 19, H.R. 1318, and H.R. 639 en bloc, was not objected to.

- **H. Con. Res. 16** Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the National Peace Officers Memorial Service and the National Honor Guard and Pipe Band Exhibition.; was ordered to be reported to the House of Representatives with a favorable recommendation, without amendment, by voice vote
- **H. Con. Res. 19** Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the Greater Washington Soap Box Derby.; was ordered to be reported to the House of Representatives with a favorable recommendation, without amendment, by voice vote.
- H.R. 1318 To direct the Library of Congress to obtain a stained glass panel depicting the seal of the District of Columbia and install the panel among the stained glass panels depicting the seals of States which overlook the Main Reading Room of the Library of Congress Thomas Jefferson Building.; was ordered to be reported to the House of Representatives with a favorable recommendation, without amendment by voice vote.
- H.R. 639 To amend section 327 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act to clarify that National Urban Search and Rescue Response System task forces may include Federal employees.; was ordered to be reported to the House of Representatives with a favorable recommendation, without amendment by voice vote.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. DeFazio that each bill ordered reported today will be reported as a single Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute incorporating any amendments adopted, was NOT OBJECTED TO.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. DeFazio that staff be authorized to make all necessary technical, clarifying and conforming changes to H.Con. Res. 16. H.Con. Res. 19, H.R. 639, H.R. 1318, was NOT OBJECTED TO.

A motion by Mr. DeFazio that, pursuant to Rule XXII, clause 1, the Committee authorizes the Chair to offer such motions as may be necessary in the House to go to conference with the Senate on H.Con. Res. 16. H.Con. Res. 19, H.R. 639, H.R. 1318, or any similar measure, was NOT OBJECTED TO.

A motion by DeFazio that, pursuant to Rule XI clause 2(l), Members may have two days in which to file any supplemental, minority, additional, or dissenting views on H.Con. Res. 16. H.Con. Res. 19, H.R. 639, or H.R. 1318, was NOT OBJECTED TO.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. DeFazio that, Members may have seven days in which to file any supplemental, minority, additional, or dissenting views on the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget Views and Estimates of the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, was NOT OBJECTED TO.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. DeFazio that the Chair, after consultation with the Ranking Member, has authority to strike or revise any provision of the bills ordered reported today that would cause a sequential referral to another committee, or that would cause the bills to concurrent resolutions to be subject to a Budget Act of Rule 21 PAYGO point of order, was NOT OBJECTED TO.
