1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Funding Instruction
3 for Safety, Health, and Security Avoids Fishing Emer4 gencies Act" or the "FISH SAFE Act".

5 SEC. 2. AMENDMENT OF FEDERAL SHARE OF THE FISHING 6 SAFETY STANDARDS GRANTS.

7 (a) AMENDMENT.—Section 4502 of title 46, United
8 States Code, is amended—

9 (1) in subsection (i)(3), by striking "50" and
10 inserting "75"; and

(2) in subsection (j)(3), by striking "50" and
inserting "75".

(b) RETROACTIVE EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by subsection (a) takes effect on the day after
the date of enactment of the Frank LoBiondo Coast
Guard Authorization Act of 2018 (Public Law 115–282).

1 SEC. 3. COST SHARE.

2 The cap on the Federal share of the cost of any activ-3 ity carried out with a grant under subsections (i) and (j) of section 4502 of title 46, United States Code, as in effect 4 5 prior to the date of enactment of the Frank LoBiondo Coast Guard Authorization Act of 2018 (Public Law 115-6 7 282), shall apply to any funds appropriated under the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2017 (Public Law 115– 8 9 31) for the purpose of making such grants.

19 (a) Section 541 of title 14, United States Code, is20 amended—

(1) by striking "In" and inserting "(a) In"; and
(2) by adding at the end the following:

23 "(b) In the case of pierhead beacons, the Com-24 mandant may—

"(1) acquire, by donation or purchase in behalf
 of the United States, the right to use and occupy
 sites for pierhead beacons; and

4 "(2) properly mark all pierheads belonging to 5 the United States situated on the northern and 6 northwestern lakes, whenever the Commandant is 7 duly notified by the department charged with the 8 construction or repair of pierheads that the con-9 struction or repair of any such pierheads has been 10 completed.".

(b) Subchapter III of chapter 5 of title 14, UnitedStates Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-lowing:

14 "§ 548. Prohibition against officers and employees 15 being interested in contracts for mate16 rials, etc.

17 "No officer, enlisted member, or civilian member of 18 the Coast Guard in any manner connected with the con-19 struction, operation, or maintenance of lighthouses, shall 20 be interested, either directly or indirectly, in any contract 21 for labor, materials, or supplies for the construction, oper-22 ation, or maintenance of lighthouses, or in any patent, 23 plan, or mode of construction or illumination, or in any 24 article of supply for the construction, operation, or maintenance of lighthouses. 25

1 "§ 549. Lighthouse and other sites; necessity and suf 2 ficiency of cession by State of jurisdiction

3 "(a) No lighthouse, beacon, public pier, or landmark, shall be built or erected on any site until cession of juris-4 5 diction over the same has been made to the United States. 6 "(b) For the purposes of subsection (a), a cession by 7 a State of jurisdiction over a place selected as the site 8 of a lighthouse, or other structure or work referred to in 9 subsection (a), shall be deemed sufficient if the cession 10 contains a reservation that process issued under authority 11 of such State may continue to be served within such place.

12 "(c) If no reservation of service described in sub-13 section (b) is contained in a cession, all process may be 14 served and executed within the place ceded, in the same 15 manner as if no cession had been made.

16 "§ 550. Marking pierheads in certain lakes

17 "The Commandant of the Coast Guard shall properly
18 mark all pierheads belonging to the United States situated
19 on the northern and northwestern lakes, whenever he is
20 duly notified by the department charged with the construc21 tion or repair of pierheads that the construction or repair
22 of any such pierhead has been completed.".

23 SEC. 6. TRANSFERS RELATED TO EMPLOYEES OF THE

24 LIGHTHOUSE SERVICE.

25 (a) Section 6 of chapter 103 of the Act of June 20,
26 1918 (33 U.S.C. 763) is repealed.

(b) Subchapter II of chapter 25 of title 14, United
 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol lowing:

4 "§ 2532. Retirement of employees

5 "(a) OPTIONAL RETIREMENT.—Except as provided
6 in subsections (d) and (e), a covered employee may retire
7 from further performance of duty if such officer or em8 ployee—

- 9 "(1) has completed 30 years of active service in
 10 the Government and is at least 55 years of age;
- 11 "(2) has completed 25 years of active service in 12 the Government and is at least 62 years of age; or 13 "(3) is involuntarily separated from further per-14 formance of duty, except by removal for cause on 15 charges of misconduct or delinquency, after com-16 pleting 25 years of active service in the Government, 17 or after completing 20 years of such service and if 18 such employee is at least 50 years of age.
- 19 "(b) COMPULSORY RETIREMENT.—A covered em20 ployee who becomes 70 years of age shall be compulsorily
 21 retired from further performance of duty.
- 22 "(c) Retirement for Disability.—
- 23 "(1) IN GENERAL.—A covered employee who
 24 has completed 15 years of active service in the Gov25 ernment and is found, after examination by a med-

ical officer of the United States, to be disabled for
 useful and efficient service by reason of disease or
 injury not due to vicious habits, intemperance, or
 willful misconduct of such officer or employee, shall
 be retired.

6 "(2) RESTORATION TO ACTIVE DUTY.—Any in-7 dividual retired under paragraph (1) may, upon re-8 covery, be restored to active duty, and shall from 9 time to time, before reaching the age at which such 10 individual may retire under subsection (a), be reex-11 amined by a medical officer of the United States 12 upon the request of the Secretary of the department 13 in which the Coast Guard is operating.

14 "(d) ANNUAL COMPENSATION.—

15 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-16 graph (2), The annual compensation of a person re-17 tired under this section shall be a sum equal to one-18 fortieth of the average annual pay received for the 19 last three years of service for each year of active 20 service in the Lighthouse Service, or in a depart-21 ment or branch of the Government having a retire-22 ment system, not to exceed thirty-fortieths of such 23 average annual pay received.

24 "(2) RETIREMENT BEFORE 55.—The retirement
25 pay computed under paragraph (1) for any officer or

employee retiring under this section shall be reduced
 by one-sixth of 1 percent for each full month the of ficer or employee is under 55 years of age at the
 date of retirement.

5 "(3) NO ALLOWANCE OR SUBSISTENCE.—Re6 tirement pay under this section shall not include any
7 amount on account of subsistence or other allow8 ance.

9 "(e) EXCEPTION.—The retirement and pay provision
10 in this section shall not apply to—

"(1) any person in the field service of the
Lighthouse Service whose duties do not require substantially all their time; or

14 "(2) persons of the Coast Guard.

15 "(f) WAIVER.—Any person entitled to retirement pay 16 under this section may decline to accept all or any part 17 of such retirement pay by a waiver signed and filed with 18 the Secretary of the Treasury. Such waiver may be re-19 voked in writing at any time, but no payment of the retire-20 ment pay waived shall be made covering the period during 21 which such waiver was in effect.

22 "(g) DEFINITION.—For the purposes of this section,
23 the term 'covered employee' means an officer or employee
24 engaged in the field service or on vessels of the Lighthouse

Service, except a person continuously employed in district
 offices or shop.".

3 SEC. 7. TRANSFERS RELATED TO SURVIVING SPOUSES OF 4 LIGHTHOUSE SERVICE EMPLOYEES.

5 (a) BENEFIT TO SURVIVING SPOUSES.—Subchapter
6 II of chapter 25 of title 14, United States Code, is amend7 ed by adding after section 2532 the following:

8 "§ 2533. Surviving spouses

9 "The Secretary of the department in which the Coast 10 Guard is operating shall pay \$100 per month to the sur-11 viving spouse of a current or former employee of the 12 Lighthouse Service in accordance with section 2532 if 13 such employee dies—

14 "(1) at a time when such employee was receiv15 ing or was entitled to receive retirement pay under
16 this subchapter; or

17 "(2) from non-service-connected causes after
18 fifteen or more years of employment in such serv19 ice.".

20 (b) TRANSFERS RELATED TO SURVIVING SPOUSES
21 OF LIGHTHOUSE SERVICE EMPLOYEES.—

(1) Subchapter II of chapter 25 of title 14,
United States Code, is amended by adding after section 2533 the following:

1 "§ 2534. Application for benefits".

10 (B) Section 2534(a), as so redesignated, trans-11 ferred, and amended is further amended by striking 12 "sections 771 to 775" and inserting "section 2533". 13 (3)(A) Section 4 of chapter 761 of the Act of 14 August 19, 1950 (33 U.S.C. 774), is redesignated as 15 section 2534(b) of title 14, United States Code, 16 transferred to appear after section 2538(a) of that 17 title, and amended so that the enumerator, section 18 heading, typeface, and typestyle conform to those 19 appearing in other sections in title 14, United States 20 Code.
