AMENDMENT TO THE AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R. 2 OFFERED BY MR. GRAVES OF LOUISIANA

At the end of subtitle C of title V of division B of the bill, add the following:

1	SEC THIRD-PARTY DATA INTEGRATION PILOT PRO-
2	GRAM.
3	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after en-
4	actment of this Act, the Secretary of Transportation shall
5	establish and implement a pilot program (in this section
6	referred to as the "program") to leverage anonymous
7	crowdsourced data from third-party entities to improve
8	transportation management capabilities and efficiency on
9	Federal-aid highways.
10	(b) Goals.—The goals of the program include the
11	utilization of anonymous crowdsourced data from third
12	parties to implement integrated traffic management sys-
13	tems which leverage real-time data to provide dynamic and
14	efficient traffic-flow management for purposes of—
15	(1) adjusting traffic light cycle times to opti-
16	mize traffic management and decrease congestion;
17	(2) expanding or contracting lane capacity to
18	meet traffic demand;

1	(3) enhancing traveler notification of service
2	conditions;
3	(4) prioritizing high-priority vehicles such as
4	emergency response and law enforcement within the
5	transportation system; and
6	(5) any other purposes which the Secretary
7	deems an appropriate use of anonymous user data.
8	(c) Partnership.—In carrying out the program, the
9	Secretary is authorized to enter into agreements with pub-
10	lic and private sector entities to accomplish the goals listed
11	in subsection (b).
12	(d) Data Privacy and Security.—The Secretary
13	shall ensure the protection of privacy for all sources of
14	data utilized in the program, promoting cybersecurity to
15	prevent hacking, spoofing, and disruption of connected
16	and automated transportation systems.
17	(e) Program Locations.—In carrying out the pro-
18	gram, the Secretary shall initiate programs in a variety
19	of areas, including urban, suburban, rural, tribal, or any
20	other appropriate settings.
21	(f) BEST PRACTICES.—Not later than 3 years after
22	date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall publicly
23	make available best practices to leverage private user data
24	to support improved transportation management capabili-
25	ties and efficiency, including—

1	(1) legal considerations when acquiring private
2	user data for public purposes; and
3	(2) protecting privacy and security of individual
4	user data.
5	(g) Report.—The Secretary shall annually submit
6	a report to the Committee on Transportation and Infra-
7	structure of the House of Representatives and the Com-
8	mittee on Environment and Public Works of the Senate
9	a report detailing—
10	(1) a description of the activities carried out
11	under the pilot program;
12	(2) an evaluation of the effectiveness of the
13	pilot program in meeting goals descried in sub-
14	section (b);
15	(3) policy recommendations to improve integra-
16	tion of systems between public and private entities;
17	and
18	(4) a description of costs associated with equip-
19	ping and maintaining systems.
20	(h) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
21	authorized to be appropriated such sums as are necessary
22	to carry out the program.

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1 (i) Sunset.—On a date that is 5 years after the en-

2 actment of this Act, this program shall cease to be effec-

3 tive.
