The Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure met at 11:00 a.m. on July 28, 2021, in 2167 Rayburn House Office Building and virtually, pursuant to notice, in an open session, a quorum being present, and considered the following measures:

- H.R. 3095, To ensure that authorizations issued by the Secretary of Transportation to foreign air carriers do not undermine labor rights or standards, and for other purposes. The “Fair and Open Skies Act”.
- H.R. 1339, To require the Secretary of Transportation to establish an advanced air mobility interagency working group, and for other purposes. The “Advanced Air Mobility Coordination and Leadership Act”.
- H.R. 3193, To amend the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 to provide for a high-speed broadband deployment initiative. The “Eliminating Barriers to Rural Internet Development Grant Eligibility Act” or the “E-BRIDGE Act”.
- H.R. 3037, To make available necessary disaster assistance for families affected by major disasters, and for other purposes. The “Housing Survivors of Major Disasters Act of 2021”.
- H.R. 3709, To direct the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency to submit to Congress a report on preliminary damage assessments and make necessary improvements to processes in the Federal Emergency Management Agency, and for other purposes. The “Preliminary Damage Assessment Improvement Act of 2021”.
- H.R. 4679, To designate the Federal building located at 1200 New Jersey Avenue Southeast in Washington, DC, as the “Norman Yoshio Mineta Federal Building”.
- H.R. 4660, To designate the Federal building and United States Courthouse located at 1125 Chapline Street in Wheeling, West Virginia, as the “Frederick P. Stamp, Jr. Federal Building and United States Courthouse.”
- H.R. 2220, To amend title 40, United States Code, to modify the treatment of certain bargain-price options to purchase at less than fair market value, and for other purposes.
- H. Con. Res. 41, Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the National Peace Officers Memorial Service and the National Honor Guard and Pipe Band Exhibition.
- 12 General Services Administration’s Capital Investment and Leasing Program Resolutions.

The Committee took the following actions:

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**H.R. 3095**, To ensure that authorizations issued by the Secretary of Transportation to foreign air carriers do not undermine labor rights or standards, and for other purposes. Was ordered to be favorably reported to the House of Representatives, without amendment, by voice vote.

(L) Groups representing consumer interests.  
(M) Groups representing the interests of taxpayers.; was AGREED TO by voice vote.

An amendment to the Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute offered by Mr. Perry (#1B); Page 4, after line 13, insert the following: (L) Petroleum refineries, petroleum marketers, and petrochemical manufacturers.; was WITHDRAWN.

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**H.R. 3193**, To amend the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 to provide for a high-speed broadband deployment initiative. Was ordered to be favorably reported to the House of Representatives, without amendment, by voice vote.

The Chair discharged the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management from further consideration of H.R. 3193.

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**H.R. 3037**, To make available necessary disaster assistance for families affected by major disasters, and for other purposes. Was ordered to be favorably reported to the House of Representatives, without amendment, by voice vote.

The Chair discharged the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management from further consideration of H.R. 3037.

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**H.R. 3709**, To direct the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency to submit to Congress a report on preliminary damage assessments and make necessary improvements to processes in the Federal Emergency Management Agency, and for other purposes. Was ordered to be favorably reported to the House of Representatives, without amendment, by voice vote.

The Chair discharged the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management from further consideration of H.R. 3709.

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**H.R. 4679**, To designate the Federal building located at 1200 New Jersey Avenue Southeast in Washington, DC, as the “Norman Yoshio Mineta Federal Building”. Was ordered to be favorably reported to the House of Representatives, without amendment, by voice vote.

The Chair discharged the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management from further consideration of H.R. 4679

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**H.R. 4660**, To designate the Federal building and United States Courthouse located at 1125 Chapline Street in Wheeling, West Virginia, as the “Frederick P. Stamp, Jr. Federal Building and United States Courthouse. Was ordered to be favorably reported to the House of Representatives, without amendment, by voice vote.

The Chair discharged the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management from further consideration of H.R. 4660.

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**H.R. 2220**, To amend title 40, United States Code, to modify the treatment of certain bargain-price options to purchase at less than fair market value, and for other purposes. Was ordered to be favorably reported to the House of Representatives, without amendment, by voice vote.

The Chair discharged the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management from further consideration of H.R. 2220.

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**H.Con.Res. 41**, Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the National Peace Officers Memorial Service and the National Honor Guard and Pipe Band Exhibition. Was ordered to be favorably reported to the House of Representatives, without amendment, by voice vote.

reported as a single Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute incorporating any amendments adopted, was NOT OBJECTED TO.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. Larsen that staff be authorized to make all necessary technical, clarifying and conforming changes to H.R. 1339, H.R. 2220, H.R. 3037, H.R. 3095, H.R. 3193, H.R. 3709, H.R. 4660, H.R. 4679, and H.Con. Res. 41; was NOT OBJECTED TO.

A motion by Mr. Larsen that, pursuant to Rule XXII, clause 1, the Committee authorizes the Chair, or designee, to offer such motions as may be necessary in the House to go to conference with the Senate on H.R. 1339, H.R. 2220, H.R. 3037, H.R. 3095, H.R. 3193, H.R. 3709, H.R. 4660, H.R. 4679, and H.Con. Res. 41; or any similar measure, was NOT OBJECTED TO.

Pursuant to Rule XI clause 2(1), of the Rules of the House of Representative, the Chair notes that Members may have two calendar days in which to file any supplemental, minority, additional, or dissenting views on H.R. 1339, H.R. 2220, H.R. 3037, H.R. 3095, H.R. 3193, H.R. 3709, H.R. 4660, H.R. 4679, or H.Con. Res. 41.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. Larsen that, the Chair, after consultation with the Ranking Member, has authority to strike or revise any provision of the bills ordered reported today that would cause a sequential referral to another committee, or that would cause the bills to concurrent resolutions to be subject to a Budget Act of Rule 21 PAYGO point of order, was NOT OBJECTED TO.
